PORTLAND MEMORIAL MAUSOLEUM QUICK FACTS

- Established in 1900 by a group of local citizens and business people as the “Portland Cremation Association”, it was originally designed as a modern crematory with 3 chambers and 2 chapels. It is the oldest crematory West of the Mississippi. The duck pond and waterfall to the north were built in 1915.
- Several acres of land were donated to the city in the late sixties, which became the “Oaks Bottom” trail. Currently, there are several thousand niches, cremation garden and vault spaces available for sale. In addition, there are over 2 acres of land remaining for future development which could theoretically make room for another 40,000 memorial spaces.
- Most of the stained glass art (skylights & windows) were designed, constructed and installed by the Povey brothers, Gerlich & Louis C. Tiffany.
- Most of the marble statuary was hand carved from Carrara marble at the Tavarelli Studios in Italy, then shipped to Oregon. Most of the marble fronts on the vaults (crypts) and niches come from Italy.
- Portland Memorial Mausoleum has one of three exact re-creations of Michelangelo’s famous Pieta’. It weighs close to 7,000 lbs and was carved by Tavarelli Studios in 1969 and the marble is from the same Italian quarry where Michelangelo carved the Pieta’ in 1499.
- Humphrey Bogart’s first wife (Mayo Methot Bogart) is entombed in the Portland Memorial Mausoleum, along with most of the Portland Memorial Mausoleum founders, the Povey Brothers (stained glass artists) and many Portland city fathers, politicians and other influential business people of Oregon.
- Because of its unique construction of steel, granite and concrete, the Portland Memorial Mausoleum was designated as a bomb shelter during WWII.
- The Portland Memorial historically had its own construction crew which designed and built most of the existing structure. The funeral home and modern crematories were added in 1970.
- The Portland Memorial Mausoleum has 8 floors, 3 elevators and over 4 miles of indoor corridors.
- Today, there are over 75,000 memorials incorporated within the building spread out over 4 acres. It would take almost 75 acres to accomplish this in a traditional cemetery.
- During the last 30 years, ownership and management of the Portland Memorial has gone through several different structures since the original founder’s families have all passed away. Recently ownership and management was transferred to 2 local Oregon families who had operated Wilhelm Funeral Home (just 1 block East) for many years. Following this change of management in February 2008, the name was officially changed to **WILHELM’S PORTLAND MEMORIAL FUNERAL HOME**. Since then, hundreds of man hours and many thousands of dollars have been invested to restore, repair and preserve one of Portland’s most significant and historic buildings.
- With the help of our staff and many volunteers, we have already completed many of these restoration projects, including the largest outdoor hand painted mural in the United States. It depicts the abundant wildlife in the Oaks Bottom area west of our structure.

Going North I-5

-Take EXIT 297 toward Terwilliger Blvd.

0.3 mi

-Keep right to take the Terwilliger Blvd. ramp.

0.3 mi

-Turn right onto SW Terwilliger Blvd.

0.5 mi

-Turn left onto SW Taylors Ferry Rd. Starbucks is on the corner

If you reach SW Lobelia St you've gone about 0.1 miles too far

1.0 mi

-Turn right onto SW Macadam Ave/OR-43. SW Macadam Ave is just past SW Virginia Ave

If you are on SW Miles St and reach SW Miles Pl you've gone about 0.1 miles too far

0.5 mi

-Turn slight left onto Sellwood Bridge.

0.4 mi

-Sellwood Bridge becomes SE Tacoma St.

0.4 mi

-Turn left onto SE 13th Ave. SE 13th Ave is just past SE 11th Ave

Portofino Caffe Italiano is on the left (If you reach SE 15th Ave you've gone a little too far)

0.7 mi

-Turn left onto SE 14th Ave. SE 14th Ave is just past SE Rural St

6705 SE 14TH AVE is on the left.

Going South I-5

Merge onto I-5 S toward Portland (Crossing into Oregon).

8.5 mi

Take the OR-99E exit, EXIT 300B, toward US-26 E/Oregon City/Omsi.

0.4 mi

Keep left to take the ramp toward Oregon City/Omsi.

0.3 mi

Keep right to take the ramp toward US-26/McLoughlin Blvd.

0.1 mi

Turn slight left onto SE Martin Luther King Jr Blvd/OR-99E S. Continue to follow OR-99E S.

2.0 mi

Take the Milwaukie Ave. ramp toward Westmoreland.

0.1 mi

Turn slight right onto SE Milwaukie Ave.

0.7 mi

8. Turn right onto SE Duke St

0.1 mi

9. Turn left onto SE 14th Ave. Destination will be on the right
